

Morningview Foundation has offered an historic \$3 million matching gift for Headwaters Health Care Foundation!

Morningview Foundation has committed up to one million dollars per year for three years to match community support for **Smart Headwaters**, the campaign to bring MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging) and more to Headwaters Health Care Centre (HHCC). New donations and three-year pledges to the campaign will be matched beginning September 1st, 2023.

Morningview Foundation explained the significance of their pledge saying, "we believe that *Smart Headwaters* will transform care for every patient at Headwaters Health Care Centre. The hospital is investing in MRI, advanced health information technology, vital new equipment, nursing education and more, to improve the patient experience at every step in their journey of care."

**Smart Headwaters** is a transformative \$18 million fundraising campaign, aimed at acquiring a cutting-edge MRI machine and other vital medical technology to enhance diagnostic capabilities and elevate patient care within our community. This ambitious campaign represents a major milestone for the hospital and its commitment to providing exceptional health care services to the residents of Dufferin-Caledon.

The centerpiece of *Smart Headwaters* is the acquisition of a state-of-the-art MRI. The new MRI technology will revolutionize medical imaging services at HHCC, allowing for more accurate and timely diagnoses, improved treatment planning, and enhanced patient outcomes.

Headwaters Health Care Centre has long been dedicated to delivering exceptional community health care, and this campaign aligns perfectly with that vision. With the new MRI machine, we will be able to provide our patients with advanced imaging services closer to home, reducing the need for long-distance travel and ensuring timely access to critical diagnostic information.






compassionate care to our community, while our expanded dialysis unit and additional investments in medical technology will give our health care team the space and tools they need to provide the exceptional care they are capable of."

# CHARLENE'S STORY

My mom has survived breast cancer three times. Naturally, I started having annual mammograms early, and appreciated being able to go to Headwaters for this health care service each year. In September of 2020 I went for my regular mammogram; I had no symptoms and no lumps. But the radiologist at Headwaters saw something out of the ordinary that day, and so decided to take a few more pictures. A few days later, my family doctor confirmed that I needed a biopsy and on October 7th I received the news that no one ever wants to receive in their lifetime. I had breast cancer.

One week later I received a partial mastectomy to remove the tumor, and despite the challenges of the pandemic, my health care journey proceeded quickly. On November 2nd, I met with my oncologist to create a treatment plan. Looking back, I feel real disappointment that no one explained to me that I could receive my cancer treatment at Headwaters. My chemotherapy was instead scheduled multiple times per week at a larger hospital an hour away.

Treatment there felt like total chaos. I couldn't believe how many people were coming in and out of the oncology unit every day. I felt like a number. I had been poked so many times that it became a challenge to find a vein, and at times I felt like I was an inconvenience for staff.

When facing a disease like cancer, one builds a strong community of supporters and bonds with others who have been through treatment as well. One cancer survivor friend I spoke with revealed that she received her chemotherapy at Headwaters. Until then, I had no idea that was possible, but the very next day, I got the paperwork started to transfer my treatments to Headwaters. The process took a few weeks, but it was seamless. It was worth it – I felt such gratitude.

Walking into the oncology unit at Headwaters for the first time, I remember thinking to myself "wow, this is such a different experience from what I am used to." From setting up my

appointments to receiving my treatments, the care was seamless. The health care team at Headwaters is unique. The people are empathetic and kind. I never once felt rushed. It was an amazing experience. Going to my chemo appointments felt like a day in the spa at Headwaters. They knew who I was, and I knew that they cared for me and my journey. There is something to be said about small town local care that you just don't get at big city hospitals.

When going through a critical illness, the last thing you want to worry about is the time and expense it takes to travel to another city. You already feel unwell – you don't want to sit in a car for hours at a time. I am so thankful that I was informed about treatment at Headwaters. There is a sense of community here that you can't find anywhere else.

On December 8th, 2021, I was lucky enough to ring the bell to signify the end of my cancer treatments at Headwaters. I felt so much pride that day and I couldn't have done it without the help of the amazing staff and team.

Receiving treatment during a global pandemic felt very lonely at times, but I am grateful that it gave me time to reflect and gain perspective on how I could use my experience to give back out of appreciation. I hope you will consider making a gift too, because I can assure you from my firsthand experience how important it is to have a local community Hospital providing exceptional care.

The unfortunate truth is we all know someone who has been touched by cancer, but we can come together to ensure Headwaters has the best equipment for treatment and early detection and diagnosis. After all, if it hadn't been for my mammogram, my story could have had a very different ending.

Earlier this year, Headwaters became a Certified Ontario Breast Assessment Site where my mom and I continue to have annual mammograms. This would not have been possible without community support through fundraising for the latest 3-D digital mammography equipment.

Thanks to generous people like you, thousands of women are able to receive the care they need, with the compassion they deserve, close to home.
